How will doing a VET program contribute to my SACE?

The flexibility of the SACE enables students to include a significant amount of VET in their SACE studies. The 'SACE Credits' column in the table in this brochure shows the SACE information relevant to each particular course (i.e. number of SACE credits and SACE stage). Please refer to the information in this brochure and also on the SAFTS website www.safts.sa.edu.au. Please also speak to your VET Coordinator for more information.

Training Guarantee for SACE Students (TGSS)

The Training Guarantee for SACE Students (TGSS) is for students who know they want to start a planned vocational pathway whilst still at school as part of their SACE and then continue after they leave school. Through TGSS, the South Australian Government offers subsidised training with a Training Provider for selected SACE students who are 16 years of age or older, undertaking substantive VET within the SACE and have relevant work experience or VET training. If a VET course you are applying for indicates that it is TGSS, students must complete a Form A along with the application form. Unique Student Identifier

ALL students who are studying nationally recognised training delivered by a registered training organisation need to have a Unique Student Identifier (USI). A USI is a reference number that will allow all of an individual's training records to be linked in the national vocational education and training (VET) data collection. To register for a USI, please go to - www.usi.gov.au

Travel Arrangements

If students have chosen to participate in a course at another SAFTS school, parents / caregivers will be required to arrange transport for their child to the training and work placements. A transport permission form will need to be completed prior to courses commencing.

Selection Guidelines

Selection for entry to courses will be based on the following guidelines:

- Identified relevant interest and/or previous work experience
- Identified career pathway
- For Training Guarantee for SACE Students (TGSS), students must meet eligibility criteria.



How to Apply

1. Read the information in this brochure.
2. Read the detailed course descriptor on the SAFTS website - www.safts.sa.edu.au under 'curriculum'.
3. Complete the Student Application Form for 2018 Courses and the Commitment to Pay. These forms need to be returned to your VET Coordinator.
4. You will be provided with more information about the course from the SAFTS, including selection and enrolment procedures which may include attending information sessions at the Host School and/or selection interview.
5. You will be advised of the enrolment outcome early in Term 4.
6. You may need some further subject counselling to ensure that your VET course is included in your SACE and school timetable.

The Southern Adelaide and Fleurieu Trade School (SAFTS) is a consortium of schools in the Southern Adelaide, Fleurieu Peninsula and Kangaroo Island regions (see back page for member schools).

Students access a range of vocational courses across the region hosted by local schools working with the local community and industry. At the same time, young people will be able to achieve their South Australian Certificate of Education (SACE) whilst learning skills and working toward industry-accredited qualifications. They will be better prepared to take on apprenticeships and skilled jobs in areas that include the areas identified as having skills shortages.

Vocational Education and Training (VET) forms an integral piece of the Australian education system. The sector partners with industry and government to equip people, particularly younger people, with workplace-specific skills and knowledge designed to meet current and future employment demands.

There are many reasons why students and their parents should consider VET options when planning a pathway to a career. VET continues to deliver great results in a range of areas and, because of its links with industry's cutting edge, has proven itself to be more flexible, adaptable, practicable and up-to-date.

What are the benefits of choosing a VET course?

- Gaining a nationally-recognised qualification while completing your SACE.
- Getting a 'head start' in your chosen career.
- Making your senior school study more relevant and interesting.
- Providing opportunities to learn 'on-the-job' through workplace learning.
- Gaining the skills and knowledge that employers look for.
- Providing pathways into apprenticeships, traineeships, further education or training and direct employment.

Structured Workplace Learning (SWL)

SWL is an opportunity for students to experience a real or simulated workplace opportunity relevant to their VET program. The benefits of SWL include: learning new skills, working as part of a team, experiencing the workplace environment and becoming better informed for further career choices. Many VET courses require students to undertake SWL. Before participating in SWL, your Home School will ensure that you have participated in the workplace preparation program. You will also need to complete a Workplace Learning Agreement form through your Home School.

Course Fees

There is a cost for students to undertake any VET course which covers course fees, consumables, equipment and the Registered Training Organisations (RTO's) cost for delivering the course. Invoices will be sent in Week 4 of the school term in Term 1 and must be paid by the due date indicated on the invoice or an instalment plan must be arranged. Every student must have returned a completed and signed Commitment to Pay Course Fees with their initial enrolment. If students provide notification to withdraw from their course after invoices have been sent out, payment of course fees is still required.
